

## **MEDICAL RADIATION TECHNOLOGISTS**

---

Medical radiation technologists play a vital role in the diagnosis and treatment of injuries and illnesses. They operate equipment that uses radiation, X-rays and other forms of electromagnetic energy to administer treatment and produce images of body structures. Hospitals, cancer treatment centres, clinics and radiological laboratories employ medical radiation technologists.

Medical radiation technology is a regulated profession.

To practise medical radiation technology in Manitoba you must:

- have completed a medical radiation technology training program at a university, college or hospital education program (OR a recognized program at another facility)
- have a minimum of 1,950 working hours (approximately equivalent to one year full-time) of experience as a medical radiation technologist within the past five years
- be registered with Manitoba Association of Medical Radiation Technologists

### **You must complete the following steps:**

**STEP 1:** Contact the Manitoba Association of Medical Radiation Technologists and tell them you are an internationally educated medical radiation technologist and would like information on how to become licensed to practise in Manitoba.

**STEP 2:** Contact Canadian Association of Medical Radiation Technologists and tell them you are an internationally educated medical radiation technologist in the process of becoming licensed to practise in Manitoba..

**STEP 3:** Complete the Canadian Association of Medical Radiation Technologists application form for certification.

You must submit the following:

- notarized copies of transcript, certificate and/or diploma\*
- verification of work experience\*
- proof of language proficiency in English or French (if not first language)
- the syllabus from the completed university, college or hospital education program\*

**STEP 4:** Complete the certification examination to obtain a Canadian Association of Medical Radiation Technologists certificate.

**STEP 5:** Register to practise in Manitoba with the Manitoba Association of Medical Radiation Technologists.


### **Other information**

Annual association registration fee is \$285.

Certification examinations are scheduled for January, May and September in Winnipeg and in Brandon. The fee is \$750 for 2009 and \$800 for 2010.
